

**Ohio Sitting Machine Challenge Evaluation Criteria:** In addressing the specific issues of the design challenge, submissions must clearly demonstrate the design solution's response to the following requirements:

- Clear and easily comprehensible design.
- Originality.
- Ergonomically comfortable entry piece.
- Aesthetically pleasing entry piece.
- Cleverness of craft and details (innovative construction techniques).
- Identification card affixed to sitting machine on bottom (out of sight).
